Private foundations and charities that have traditionally funded academic scientists have started doing the once-unthinkable: writing checks for millions of dollars to forprofit companies.*

Translation research is getting a major boost from non-profit medical advocacy groups and organizations like the National Institutes of Health. **The Medical Foundation and NIH Translational Research Forum at the 2007 BIO International Convention** will bring together the major funders of translational research to let pharma and biotech companies and academic centers know how they can get involved in foundation and NIH-driven translational research.

Consider these recent developments:

• In late 2006, the Juvenile Diabetes Research

Foundation (JDFR) agreed to send **\$3 million to Sangamo BioSciences, Inc.** It also announced funding for a phase-2 trial by Transition Therapeutics, Inc. and a phase-3 trial by TolerRx Inc.

- In January, 2007, the JDFR announced a \$2 million grant to MacroGenics, Inc. for a phase-2/3 antibody clinical trial.
- Also in January, the Michael J. Fox Foundation awarded **Sangamo \$950,000** for gene-regulation research.
- And in March, Families of Spinal Muscular Atrophy announced a nearly \$500,000 grant to Paratek Pharmaceuticals, Inc.

The Translational Research Forum has enlisted the top trend-makers as participants. They include presidents and CEOs of a dozen of the industry's top funders including JDRF, the Michael J. Fox Foundation, Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, The Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis Association, the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation, and others.

Plus, Monday Luncheon Keynote Speaker, **Michael J. Fox,** will address the need to drive translational research to develop novel therapies for Parkinson's disease.
